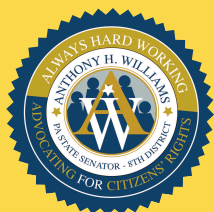

Harrisburg Update: **CAPITOL BRIEF**

■ **Clean Slate Legislation**

In our fight to improve Pennsylvania's criminal justice system, the Senate unanimously passed my Clean Slate bill. The legislation will improve current law by automatically sealing certain eligible non-violent criminal records without anyone having to file a petition in court. Nearly three million working-age Pennsylvanians are estimated to have criminal records. Many have only minor offenses, such as misdemeanors, while others simply have arrests without conviction.

Sealing minor, non-violent offenses will provide otherwise productive citizens with a better opportunity to secure life-sustaining employment. Despite their commitment to live more productive lives, criminal records often prevent many from being considered for the kind of employment that provides for their families and, ultimately, helps decrease their risk of reoffending. At the heart of this issue is a stronger and safer community for us all to enjoy.

■ **Stolen Valor Legislation**

Service to country and community is engrained in the fabric of our society. We serve in many ways – as block captains, community leaders, elected officials – but, military service is unlike any other. That's why I've been fighting for years to make it a crime to impersonate a soldier or a veteran when it is done with the intention of fraudulently obtaining money, property, or other benefits.

After my colleagues in the General Assembly rallied around the issue, the legislation I first introduced in 2011 was finally signed into law this year. Honoring the sacrifice of those who serve in our armed forces has been a highlight of my career in public service.

■ **2017- 2018 Budget & "Stop and Gos"**

During this year's budget negotiations, I stood with my colleagues from Philadelphia against troublesome "stop and gos." Although we haven't yet completed the budget process, the Senate passed a bill to rid our communities of nuisance "stop-and-gos," where liquor is sold in establishments that do not properly follow food, seating and other licensing requirements.

These "stop and go" establishments threaten the safety of our neighborhoods. When the bill becomes law, liquor enforcement officers will be able to suspend operating privileges for businesses that do not pass inspection. Raising the level of accountability will help ensure we can all enjoy living in neighborhoods where improper conduct is not incentivized.

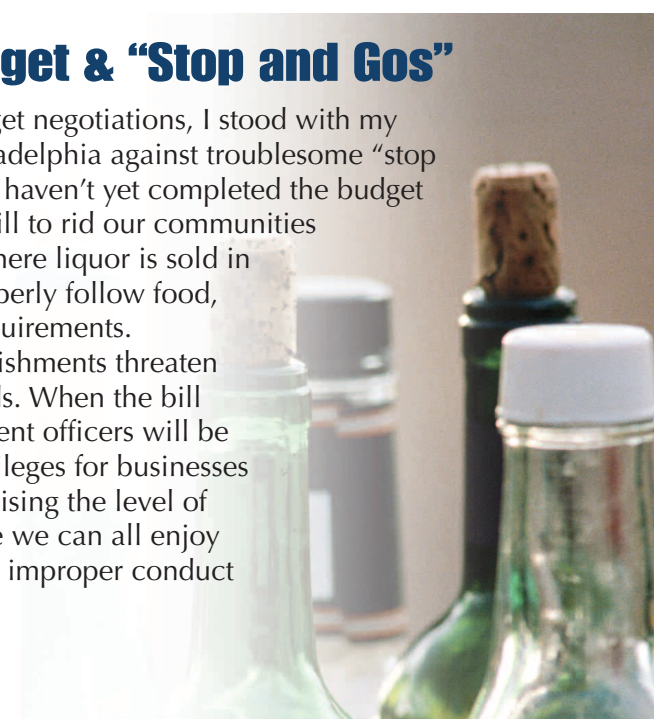
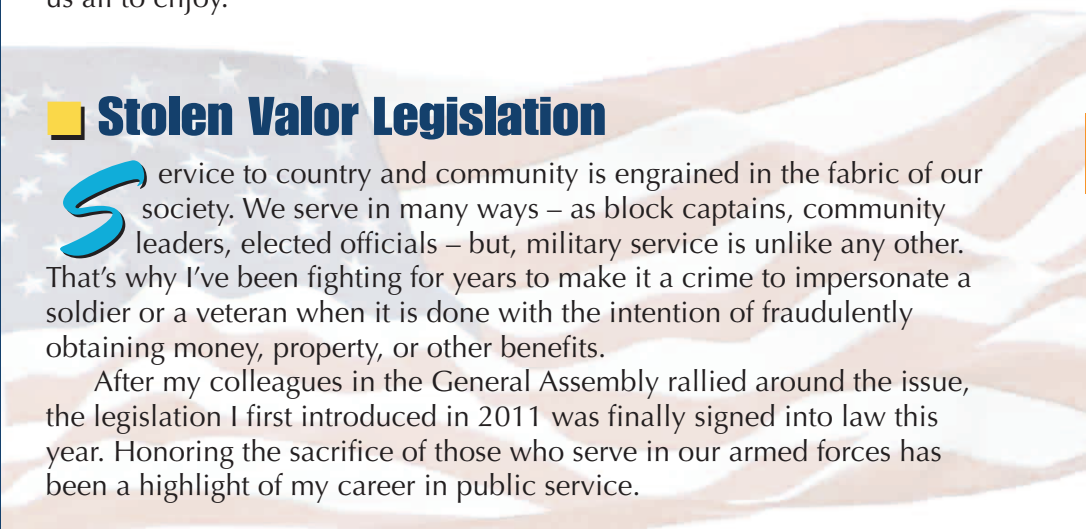
